They will firstly be re-roofing the playground shelters on the front playground and then also replacing the front of the storage building. Secondly, and even more excitingly, they will be re-surfacing our extremely uneven and lumpy front playground; this is a massive piece of work which will entail making good the drainage underneath as well.

The first job will take about six weeks and is scheduled to begin during half-term. This area will be marked off so the playground will still be safe for use, but the bike-sheds by the Chapel Road entrance will not be in use during this time. The re-laying

of the playground is scheduled for the Summer Holidays, so will be a welcome surprise when we return to school in September.


In Science, they have been learning about blood, which they made in a practical lesson, and the circulatory system. Finally,


