I can't believe that we are at the very end of the academic year- the last term, in particular, seems to have flown by with a flurry of activities and events. I just wanted to use my last letter of the term to reflect on some of the things that have taken place this term, and look forward to what's in store next year.

I'd also like to thank you for the number of responses to our Parent Voice survey last week- a really high number at 136. The results were extremely pleasing with 90% of respondents reporting that they agreed or strongly agreed that their child was happy at school; 93% saying that their child feels safe at school, 88% feeling that their child was doing well at school and 92% saying they would recommend the school to others. 87% found their child's report useful and informative and the feedback from the comments box was very useful.

We want to improve the ways we make you aware of what your children learn and do throughout the year, and we also know we need to challenge ourselves further to have the highest expectations of every child. These targets will be added to our School Development Plan. and we will continue to survey you at intervals so that we can gauge your opinions on a variety of school issues. We know that working in partnership with you is key to consistently growing and improving our school.

I would also like to say a big well done to the children and staff for their hard work this term, especially in relation to the years that took external assessments- the Reception Early Learning Goals, the Year 1 Phonics test, the Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 standardised assessments
