The assessments are not quite over as now Mrs. Riggs and Miss Milburn are busy making assessments of the Year 6 writing which we have to submit to the Local Authority and Department for Education.

Attendance has been excellent in both these year groups, and we thank parents for their support in ensuring this.

Attendance Update

Term-time holidays and other unauthorised absence

Requests for family holidays will not be authorised during term-time. If you are taking your children out of school for this purpose, the time off will be marked as unauthorised, and you could receive a Penalty Notice.

Unauthorised absence includes:

- parents keeping children off school unnecessarily e.g. because they had a late night or for noninfectious illness or injury that would not affect their ability to learn;
- absences which have never been properly explained;
- children who arrive at school after the close of registration are marked using a 'U'. This indicates that they are in school for safeguarding purposes however this is recorded as an absence for the session;
- shopping trips;
- looking after other children or children accompanying siblings or parents to medical appointments;
- their own or family birthdays;
- holidays taken during term time without leave not deemed 'for exceptional purposes' by the headteacher may result in the school applying to the local authority to issue a penalty notice or, if you have previously been issued a Penalty Notice, the school may request a direct prosecution by the local authority;
- day trips;
- other leave of absence in term time which has not been agreed.


