We've had a lovely start to the new school year with the children full of enthusiasm for learning and some exciting developments in progress. Parent Communication

Look out for more of these events, as well as an Art Exhibition in November.

Hopefully, many of you have noticed the eye-catching Artwork and Wall Displays which are now prevalent throughout the school.

There is a board for every curriculum area, and we aim to showcase the progression of each subject throughout the school.

Census Day

Census Day was the first of our themed lunch days this year and it was great to see the level of anticipation in the air. We served a staggering 308 dinners in the Stanway American Diner, and the children were very excited to see the staff dressed up in their baseball caps and stars and

stripes aprons with jukebox hits jangling in the background. We will be sticking to an international theme with French day next on the agenda—what will the kitchen have in store for us then?!



Behaviour for Learning One major drive this term has been to reinstate our behaviour expectations throughout the school. This has been led by the Year 6s modelling behaviour and taking on prefect roles in the school. Little things like making sure that children are smart as they enter the school building and assembly hall, tucking their shirts in and making sure that they present a polished image are helping children to realise that our presentation is key in being school-ready. We are also being sticklers for manners and politeness—children answering politely when they are greeted by an adult and remembering pleases and thank yous. 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Daily Attendance

Even only two or three days missed every half-term equates to 18 weeks of missed learning throughout the primary phase— almost half a year of schooling...

Whilst any child may occasionally have time off school because they are ill, sometimes they can be reluctant to attend school. Any problems with regular attendance are best sorted out between the school, the parents and the child. If a parent thinks their child is reluctant to attend school then we will work with that family to understand the root problem and provide any necessary support. We can use outside agencies to help with this such as the School Nurse, The Local Authority or a Child and Family Support Worker.
