Governor-Update

WELLBEING

The wellbeing of our whole school community is an important priority for the Governing Board, and last year we established a wellbeing sub-committee to monitor and support the wellbeing of staff. Since then, we have conducted 3 staff wellbeing surveys and identified a number of ways to further support their mental health and wellbeing. We believe our staff are our most important resource, and to ensure they can provide the best learning experiences for our pupils it's important they are supported so they can be happy and healthy in all aspects of their lives, both at home and at work. We have put in place a number of actions in recent months including:

- a Mental Health and Wellbeing Charter outlining our commitment to ensuring Stanway Primary provides a consistent, positive, and safe environment which prioritises staff wellbeing and promotes good mental health
- raising awareness of wellbeing support available to staff both withing the school and through external charities (covering mental, financial and physical wellbeing)
- Regular wellbeing drop-in sessions for staff with members of the senior leadership team
- Mr Godwin is now trained as a Mental Health First Aider
- Wellbeing surveys completed every April and October to monitor progress and identify ways we can support staff better
- We have also received an anonymous donation to decorate the staffroom area to make this an environment where staff can take their breaks in a relaxed and calm space. This is something that a team of volunteers will be completing over the Easter holidays.

GOVERNOR SCHOOL MONITORING VISITS

Monitoring visits provide governing boards with essential information about how their strategy is being implemented and how issues discussed at governor meetings translate into the everyday life of the school. Visiting school on a planned, regular basis allows governors to:

- better understand their school's strengths and areas for development
- determine if agreed policies and procedures are working in practice
- identify how resources are being used
- show staff and pupils that they are interested in school life, work and achievements
- experience the culture and ethos of the school.

Over the last few months, Governors have undertaken visits covering the following areas:-

- Safeguarding
- Mathematics
- Whole Governing Body morning covering Quality of Education and Behaviour and Attitudes
- Health & Safety
- Attendance at the Year 4 production

WHY IS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE SO IMPORTANT FOR OUR CHILDREN?

Each week in the School Bulletin, the attendance percentage for each class for the previous week is listed. You may ask, 'Why does the school inform the parents of this data?'

There are a number of answers to this question, but one is that being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for pupils to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe, providing access to extra-curricular activities and pastoral care.

Parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure that their child receives a full-time education.

Research has shown that those pupils who perform better at school missed fewer days that those who did not perform as well. Indeed, data has shown that children who did not achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.

There are a few exceptional circumstances where missing a school day is permitted. Your child should only be kept away from school due to illness if they:

- 1. Have an infectious illness which could spread to other people
- 2. Need care during school hours that cannot be carried out in school
